# Invitation to Canadian University Students: FFIPP Internship for Human Rights and Just Peace in Palestine/Israel

#### Five weeks internship program in

Palestine/Israel that includes an intensive week long orientation tour of the land including many visits (refugee camps, settlements, etc.) and meetings with both Israeli and Palestinians scholars and activists, and one month of internship in grassroots and international organizations, human rights and research centers in the West Bank and Israel. Coming from many different world-class universities in the USA, France, Netherlands, Brazil, our interns work in places such as Jerusalem, Nablus, Haifa, Bethlehem, Hebron and Ramallah. Regular meetings and conferences are offered all along the five-week program.

Interns are supervised by local and international FFIPP staff.

Since 2002, Faculty For Israeli-Palestinian Peace (FFIPP) educational activities are rooted in a universal human ethic and the belief that students can learn best from their own experiences of living and doing volunteer work in Palestine/Israel. The internship program strives to inspire critical thinking about the conflict and the possibilities for justice and peace in the Middle East.

**Dates:** June 1 ~ July 7, 2013

**Cost:** FFIPP-USA tuition, fees and housing is \$1500. Airfare, food and living expenses are NOT covered

by FFIPP.

Scholarships: Three scholarships each of \$600 are available for 3 Canadian students from FFIPP-USA.
