

# The Canada School of Public Service National Student Paper Competition

\*<u>Attention MPPAL Students: A paid opportunity</u>
to work\*

This year, Master's and Ph.D. students are encouraged to consider one or all of the following questions in a 1,500-word essay:

- 1. What are your ideas to help ensure that the Public Service of Canada will be ready to meet the needs of the future?
- 2. What are the major social, economic, technological and/or environmental challenges facing Canada in the next decade, and what strategies should Canada pursue to address them?
- 3. What emerging issues will have a significant impact on the federal public service and service excellence for Canadians?

The Grand Prize Winner(s), selected by a panel of senior public servants, will receive:

- A paid opportunity to work directly within government on a casual contract or term assignment (4 months, during the period of May 2019 to March 2020 as determined by the hosting federal government organization or department)
- A certificate in recognition of their accomplishment
- An invitation to attend the Manion Lecture in the National Capital Region (Ottawa) or another applicable keystone event
- An opportunity to present their paper on a national platform (round-trip travel costs, if applicable, will be reimbursed for the winner(s) and their university coordinator)

This event will bring together **four** global leaders from higher Ed, business, public policy and the arts, to engage the critical concept of **inclusion** as a **driver** of **innovation**:


