Ryan's supervisor, Professor Dagmar Soenneken presented him with this award at the annual SPPA Students, Alumni and Community Recognition Awards Dinner on November 21, 2019.

Ryan recently joined *LIFT Philanthropy Partners as the Senior Manager, Impact Investing*, where he is expanding LIFT's activity in the social finance and impact investing field. LIFT turns good causes into great investments by scaling the social impact of organizations whose programs help remove barriers to health, education,

skills development and employment for vulnerable and at-risk Canadians. Prior to joining LIFT, Ryan was a Manager at the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport, providing strategic oversight of the Ministry's agencies (e.g. Royal Ontario Museum, Ontario Trillium Foundation) and previously served as a Senior Policy Advisor to the Deputy Minister. Ryan also held roles with the federal government at the Auditor General's Office and the private sector with Live Nation Canada. He holds a Chartered Professional Accounting (CPA) designation and BComm Honours. Ryan serves as the *Vice Chair of the Board of Regeneration Community Services*, a not-for-profit organization that provides housing support for persons with mental health and addiction challenges.

The Assembly of First Nations (AFN) invites nominations and applications for the position of Chief Executive Officer (CEO). The Assembly of First Nations (AFN) was established in 1982 and is modelled after the United Nations General Assembly. AFN is a national advocacy organization representing First Nations citizens in Canada currently living in 634 First Nations communities and throughout cities and towns.

The work of AFN is directed by First Nations leaders (Chiefs) through resolutions passed at Chiefs Assemblies held at least twice a year. The AFN National Executive (Executive Committee) is made up of a National Chief, ten (10) Regional Chiefs and the Chairs of Elders, Women's and Youth Council. The role of the AFN and the National Chief is to advocate on behalf of First Nations which includes: facilitating and coordinating national and regional discussions and dialogue; leading advocacy efforts and campaigns; undertaking legal and policy analysis; and communicating with governments, including facilitating relationship building between First Nations and the Crown as well as the public and private sectors and the general public. The AFN continues to be recognized as a proactive, productive and effective representative of the interests and rights of all First Nation's people. As the CEO of AFN, you will be responsible for the overall strategic planning of operations during a critical time of organizational renewal and change, as well as for the oversight and management of human and financial resources (including risk management) of the AFN. Reporting to the National Chief and the National Executive Committee, the CEO directs the organization's daily activities to achieve the goals, objectives and mandate of the AFN while maintaining the vision of the organization through lobbying, advocacy and providing support for First Nations issues.
