#### **MENTORSHIP CIRCLES – CALL FOR PARTICIPATION**

Dear alumni and students,

We are pleased to announce the launch of a new round of mentorship circles at SPPA.

Circles have 3 members (3 of the 4 categories represented in each circle):

- Level 1: 1 Upper year BPA/MPPAL student or recent graduate at entry level position
- Level 2: 1 Analyst/Advisor
- Level 3: 1 Manager

• Level 4: 1 Sr. Executive E.g.: Director, ADM, DM Each group will consist of a Level 1, 2 and 3 or a Level 2, 3 and 4.


The minimum commitment is to hold two meetings for each mentorship circle by the end of March 2019 with the aim to advance the professional development and careers of participating members. Three or more meetings are recommended based on feedback from the 2017-18 mentorship circle participants (50% of participants recommend 3 meetings, 50% recommend more than 3 meetings).
93% of the 2017-18 program participants indicated that they would take part again (7% were unsure, 0 negative responses).



The **Centre for Refugee Studies (CRS)** 13th annual Student Conference invites abstract proposals for its upcoming gathering on the theme of **"Bridging the** 

**Gap Between Refugee and Indigenous Communities**". Departing from the traditional conference approach this year, we will hold a gathering of knowledge sharing and solidarity building around discussions of colonialism/settler colonialism, and refugees' relations to the land they are currently residing on. Thus, we encourage submissions that engage and discuss ideas of displacement by dispossession (of land, culture, community, mobility) caused by colonialism and settler colonialism, as well as the relationship between the experiences of refugees and indigenous communities in Canada through multiple mediums. # **Job Opportunities**

### Public Service Commission's Post Secondary Recruitment - Advanced Policy Analyst (APA) Program

This program is an excellent way for students and recent graduates to begin a career in the federal government. The APA program develops high potential individuals for policy roles in the Government of Canada by offering recent master's level graduates the opportunity to establish a foundation of knowledge and experience in federal public administration.

Participants gain knowledge and first-hand experience by rotating through a series of four challenging six-month placements across the three central agencies—the Privy Council Office, the Department of Finance, and the Treasury Board Secretariat—and a line department in the National Capital Region.

During these placements, participants will have the opportunity to analyze and influence a variety of social, economic and international policy issues and gain work experience that would otherwise take the better part of a career to develop. The combination of hands-on work experience and training provides participants with a unique introduction to a rewarding career, and a chance to serve Canada and Canadians.

#### How Does the APA Program Work?

The APA Program is a decentralized leadership development program, run collaboratively by Deputy Ministers, who recognize the value of the program and the quality of its graduates. Trainees are sponsored by a "home department" which pays their salary and benefits for the 2 years of training. In return, trainees commit to return to their "home department" after graduation for a <u>minimum of 1 year</u>.

#### **Salary and Promotions**

Candidates enter the program at the EC-03 group and level, with a salary of \$63,428, and are eligible for promotion to the EC-04 level (\$68, 468) after one year. At the end of the two year program, participants graduate at the EC-05 level (\$81,858 - \$94,219).

#### Who Are We Looking For?

- Highly motivated individuals with a strong interest in Canadian public policy and governance.
- Candidates who have completed a Master's degree in any discipline (in the last two years), or be near completion (coursework completed with <u>grades posted</u> by June 17, 2019, degree completed by June 2020). There is also requirements for baseline economics and research methods courses.
- Individuals with a strong academic standing, who have received scholarships and awards
- Candidates with demonstrable leadership qualities and the potential to be future leaders within the Public Service
