The deadline to apply is Jan 15, but positions may fill earlier, so the sooner you get your resumes in, the better. This is a temporary 90-day contract and many of you might be hesitant to accept casual / temp contract positions, but they are excellent ways to get your foot in the door and managers try to keep people through other longer term contracts if they are working well.
