

# Charles Hopkins



What does sustainability mean to you and me? In an age of climate change and migration that increasingly forces us to understand planetary boundaries and intercultural diversity the need to understand world events from a variety of perspectives, has become increasingly critical to address some of the most pressing issues of global concern that are facing humanity in the 21st century. How can this understanding become a lifelong asset?

Prof. Charles Hopkins holds the UNESCO Chair in Reorienting Education towards Sustainability at York University Canada conducting research on Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) and coordinating two research networks. Hopkins is a public speaker and consults for institutions worldwide including United Nations agencies. governments, universities and other education stakeholders. He is advisor to the UN University's Institute of Advanced Studies in Sustainable Development, and Co-Director of the Asia-Pacific Institute on ESD in Beijing China.

The Foundation recently expanded its in-person simulation model and developed the Understanding Our Treaties website.

#### Research Officer - Centre for Industrial Relations and HR, UofT

Since 1965, the Centre for Industrial Relations and Human Resources has brought together professors from many different disciplines and departments at the University of Toronto to teach and conduct research on all aspects of the workplace and employment relationships. Under direction of the Principal Investigator and the Project Director, the incumbent will provide administrative and research support. Duties include implementing and executing qualitative and/or quantitative research methods; conducting research as assigned; collecting and summarizing research data; conducting data analysis; assisting with publication of reports; conducting literature reviews; and making recommendations towards resource requirements for projects.

#### **Policy Manager - College of Optometrists of Ontario**

The Manager, Policy and Governance, is responsible for overseeing policy development, conducting research, and providing analytical support to assist the College in fulfilling its regulatory mandate and meeting its strategic goals. The successful candidate will assist in researching, studying and interpreting current environmental trends, feedback from stakeholders, and regulatory obligations, in order to assist in the development of policy advice for the College. The successful candidate will also serve as staff support to College committees. In addition, the Manager, Policy and Governance, will coordinate the annual Council election and committee volunteer process.

#### **Director, Provincial and Government Relations - Diabetes Canada**

Reporting to the Senior Vice President, Mission, the Director, Provincial Government Relations is responsible for developing and leading Diabetes Canada's provincial government relationships. The Director will develop and implement the strategic advocacy in the provinces to improve services, care and access (except Québec). This role will also be responsible for coordinating our advocacy efforts and partnerships within the provinces. The Director will assess trends and issues within each provincial government and other key provincial decision-making bodies and determine appropriate actions with key stakeholders and volunteers.

#### **Equity and Engagement Officer- Durham Catholic District School Board**

Reporting to the Superintendent of Education responsible for Equity, the Equity and Engagement Officer will support transformational change to enhance our Catholic learning community by supporting the identification and elimination of systemic barriers. In collaboration with system and school leaders, the incumbent will engage and influence stakeholders to address systemically based human rights and equity issues.
